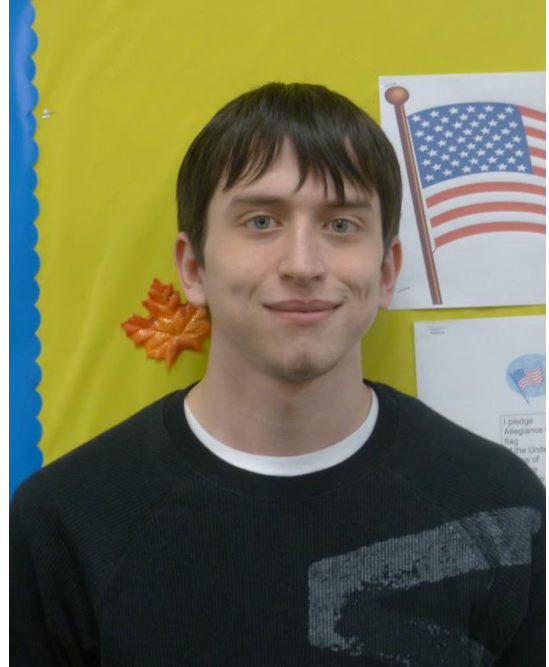


Jacob Peiffer

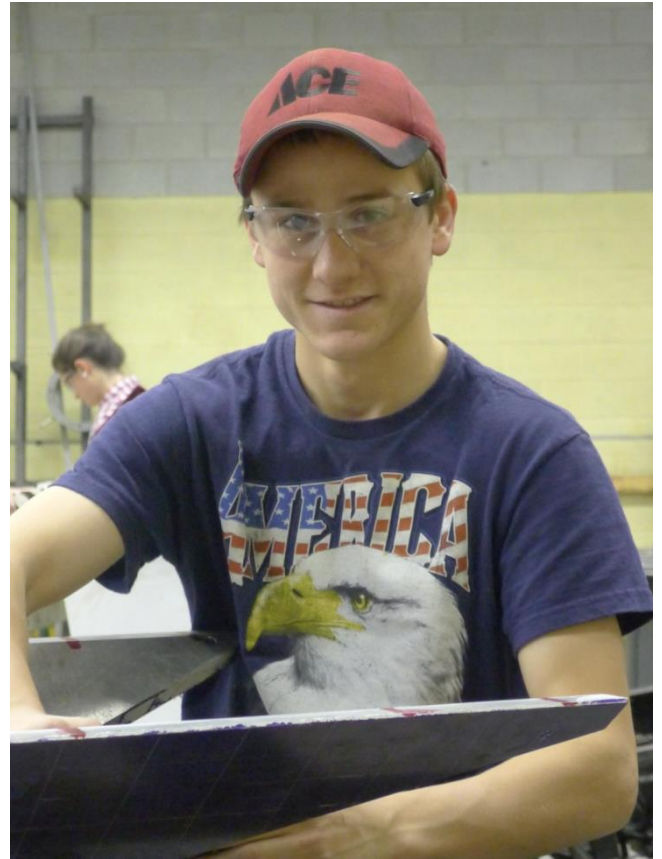
